In February of this year The Unsolicited Electronic Messages Act 2007 was passed into law.

Uninvited commercial email messages otherwise known as 'Spam' makes up an estimated 80% of worldwide email traffic.

The Unsolicited Electronic Messages Act 2007 prohibits uninvited commercial messages such as spam. It also requires senders of commercial messages (including text and instant messages used to market and promote goods, services and other schemes of a commercial or dishonest nature) to include accurate information about themselves and enables recipients to unsubscribe to emails.

The bill will require that the sending of multiple commercial electronic messages of a marketing nature over these services be made only to recipients who have opted-in to receive such messages. Senders of promotional electronic messages will be required to abide by requests from recipients to opt-out of further mailings.

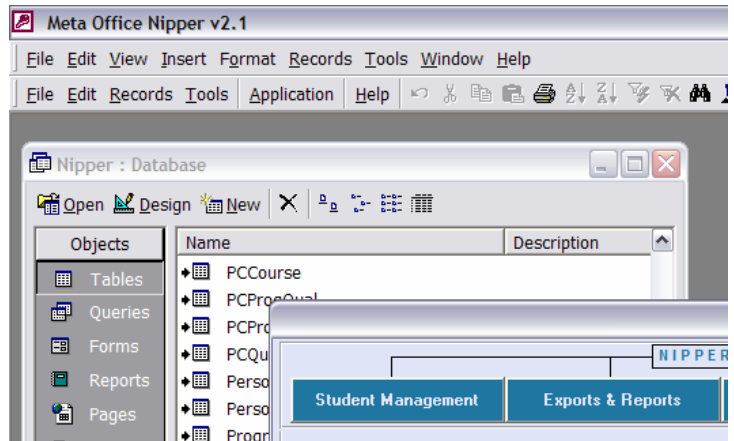

Some early versions of the Nipper front end (version 2.1) had inadvertently displayed the database window and Access menu as in the example below:



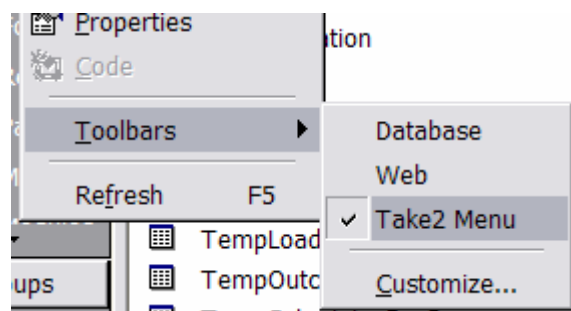
To hide these items:

1. Click on the Tools menu.
2. Click on the Startup menu option.
3. Remove the ticks from all the tick boxes except for 'Display Status Bar'.
4. Restart Nipper.

Missing Nipper toolbar

Occasionally we have had users comment on the Nipper toolbar go missing. The Nipper toolbar is useful for printing and closing reports and exporting to Microsoft Office.

1. In the Nipper folder locate the Nipper.mde file
2. Hold down the Shift key and then double-click on the mde file.
3. Click on the View menu.
4. Click on the Toolbars menu.
5. Ensure the Take2 Menu* item is selected.



6. Close the mde file and restart Nipper

* Take2 is our other software product in which Nipper utilises the same menu hence the name 'Take2 Menu'.

Force against Australian Star Wars fan

CANBERRA: An Australian movie fan on his way to pose for a Star Wars 30th anniversary photo shoot was arrested by police after his replica laser pistol was mistaken for a more earthly machine gun, media reported on Friday. The 32-year-old man, dressed in black and carrying a backpack with a replica laser blaster poking out the side, alarmed diners at a food court in central Melbourne. The man had been on his way to pose for a community newspaper ahead of the 30th Star Wars movie anniversary when he was surrounded by armed police, forced to the ground and handcuffed. Police said despite being a harmless replica and a close match to a weapon from a galaxy far, far away, the man would be charged with possessing an unregistered firearm.
